### ***GUEST SPEAKER:*** Tim Davis, City of Frederick – Transit - Friendly/Design Guidelines

Tim Davis was on hand to discuss and obtain feedback from residents regarding the concept of Transit Friendly Design.

Rapid growth and development can create many challenges: traffic congestion, sprawl development, and poor air-quality are a few. These challenges, however, become surmountable when they are viewed as opportunities to find innovative ways to address growth-related transportation issues. The development of communities that are friendly to a variety of transportation modes is an innovative way to address growth issues, to support economic development, and to improve the community's quality of life.

Transit-friendly design (TFD) integrates land use, zoning, and transportation planning elements to promote higher-density, mixed-use development that is easily accessible by various modes of transportation. TFD embraces the concepts of "smart growth" and traditional neighborhood design by encouraging higher-density development in areas with existing public services and by encouraging interconnected street networks. Pedestrian accessibility and

street-oriented site design are also important elements of TFD. Another important element of TFD is transit access design, which ensures that development sites are accessible by transit vehicles.
